5 Questions and a Cup of Coffee with...Carole Thomas

About Carole:

I grew up on a farm in the middle of Iowa, and have lived in Iowa, Germany, Oklahoma, Colorado, Tennessee, and now Pennsylvania. I am married to a wonderful man and have three grown children and four grandchildren.

I graduated from the Southwest Pennsylvania Synod in 2007.

I am a happily-retired social worker. In my career as a social worker, I was a child abuse investigator and a forensic interviewer. I then worked as an addictions counselor at a prison, and finally as an addictions counselor at a methadone clinic. Much of the work I did involved helping people find healthier methods of coping with the traumas of their pasts.

Can you describe your call to ministry?

I felt a strong call to ministry up to the time that I worked at the methadone clinic. I do believe that job allowed me to fulfill the ministry God was calling me to. It allowed me many opportunities to assist people to establish or expand their relationships with God.

I trained as a Stephen Minister over 30 years ago. I am currently a Stephen Minister to two people, and a Stephen Leader in our church. I am a firm believer in the power of Stephen Ministry.

What is the best part of your ministry now?

The best part of my ministry at this point in my life is that I now have the time to focus on ministry instead of sandwiching ministry into my job and family needs.

What is one thing about you that would surprise us?

People might be surprised that I spend as much time as possible in my kayak, and that I haul our camper-trailer around the country by myself as I spend time with my family who live all over the country. I probably drive 5,000-10,000 miles a year by myself, much of that pulling the camper.

What are three things diakonia students and graduates should keep their eyes on?

The things Diakonia students and graduates should keep their eyes on would include:

- Watching for opportunities that God provides for fulfilling ministries;
- Recognizing that ministry might be a part of your daily paying job or things you do in your church home or your neighborhood, and being aware that God often calls us to ministry in ways that we don't expect and perhaps even resist; and, at least in my experience
- Ministry is often challenging and seldom neat and tidy.

How can we pray for you?

Your prayers can help me find opportunities to use my knowledge about trauma and addiction and my passion for helping others in ways that meet the needs of God's people now that I am retired.
